It was very sad to see Jayl and Niki leave Ruardean. Their presence in the village brought us warmth and many happy times. When it was time for them to leave, many of their past students helped with the removals. Such a gesture says it all. They had touched the hearts of so many of us. Although Jayl and Niki have now moved to Kent, their contribution to Ruardean village will live on.

Jayl is a truly gifted musician who is keen to share his knowledge and is able to inspire those around him. He has a rare and genuine talent to bring communities together. In this respect, I have no hesitations to recommend him.
